# **Event description**

This day and a half case based seminar is dealing with degenerative conditions of lumbar and cervical spine.

Basic knowledge of spine degeneration will be presented first, followed by description of most frequent degenerative pathology along with guidelines for their management.

Different approaches to the spine and instrumentation techniques will be delineated in detail.

Complications related to approach and instrumentation will also be outlined along with instructions for their prevention and management.

# **Target participants**

This event is targeted at certified surgeons with up to 3 years of experience in spine surgery, who are aiming to further improve their knowledge and/or specialization in the management of degenerative conditions of the spine.
